



22 PLAYER ROSTER

The Wisconsin Youth Soccer Association and all recognized leagues within the Association shall recognize roster limits of up to 22 players on the official State roster for players at the U15, U16, U17, U18 and U19 age group levels. An official State team roster, showing roster size must be approved by the Association; it is also a good idea to have a copy of the official State roster present for all recognized competitions. A game day roster, authorized by the League, shall be prepared and submitted to the competition authority (referee crew) at a time designated by the game authority. This game day roster shall have a maximum of 18 players and a minimum of seven players.

Each team participating at the U15, U16, U17, U18 and U19 age group levels, who also chooses to participate in the National Championship Tournament, shall be eligible to utilize roster limits of up to 22 players on the official State roster. For the National Championship Tournament, a game day roster shall be prepared and submitted to the competition authority at a time set by the Association, (45 minutes) prior to game time for State Championship Tournament play. For Regional Championship Tournament play a game day roster shall be prepared and submitted to the competition authority not later than 60 minutes prior to each scheduled game in National Championship Tournament play. This game day roster shall have a maximum of 18 players and a minimum of seven players.

On the days of League competition each team shall be required to provide a game day roster to the officiating crew listing the 18 players eligible for the game; this roster may include club pass players. Club pass players, a total of four, must be listed on the game day roster. Players must be age appropriate (or younger) for the age group in which the team is competing. Players must have a current and valid laminated player pass card which includes the player's photo, player's signature, and the registrar's stamp. In the event there are questions or concerns regarding a player's eligibility, the referee must submit a detailed supplement report, along with the game report, to the competition authority citing specific concerns regarding the player's eligibility.
